ST PETER'S RING OF BELLS

Bell ringing, campanology to give it its correct name, at St Peter's Church in Wymondham has taken-off again in the last 12 months after a period of relative famine.

With a mixture of ringers travelling from Melton, and beyond, boosted by a handful of locals the bells are making themselves heard on a regular basis.



Daniel Salter is one of those that live in the village who have made time to ensure that sufficient ringers are present for practice, once a month, and to ring the peal of six bells for weddings and other occasions. The ring of bells date back to the 17th century and have been described as being "second to few in the country".



On a recent visit to the bell chamber itself, Dan captured images of the bells most would never have the opportunity to see. Thank you Dan for sharing them with us!

Fatty Batter, How Cricket saved my life (then ruined it)
By Michael Simkins (Published in 2007)

The cricket season has now started but you don't need to like cricket to enjoy this book. It is extremely funny and wonderfully entertaining.

I can do no better than to use the summary on the book itself:

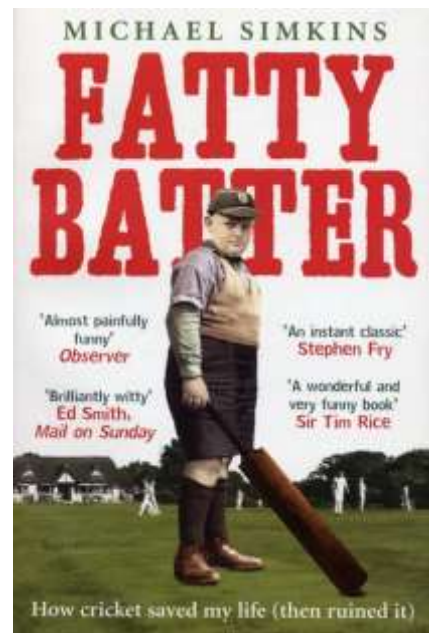
'A fat boy with a passion for sweets and a loathing of games, the young Michael Simkins finds in cricket a sport where size doesn't necessarily

matter and a full-blown obsession is born. Now in middle-age he still harbours the somewhat deluded belief that the England middle-order might usefully benefit from his hard-earned skills. From impromptu Test series played with his dad in the family sweetshop through to his years running a team of dysfunctional inadequates. Fatter Batter tells the hilarious story of one man's life lived through cricket'.

'Once you've read this account of one man's love affair with cricket, you'll never want to read another ghosted autobiography by a Pietersen or a Vaughan again – incompetence and failure is far more fun'

We've set up a whole host of competition classes aimed at adults and children. You can enter as many classes as you like but there is a limit on how many entries you can make in each.

Why not challenge family or friends to compete against you in the same class? It's all great fun!

CLASSES OPEN TO ALL AGES

- 1) **3 HENS' EGGS** : Displayed on a plate.
- 2) **5 POTATOES** : Any colour. Need to bear a card stating the variety. If the variety is unknown that must be stated.
- 3) **VEGETABLES** : 3 kinds, 2 of each type.
- 4) **VICTORIA SPONGE** : Official recipe. No deviations allowed.
- 5) **4 SWEET SCONES** : On a plate.
- 6) **BEST DECORATED CAKE** : Cake will not be cut.
- 7) **JAR OF JAM** (1lb/448g approx) : All jars must be clean and full to the top, have no trademarks or names on them and be labelled with contents and date (day, month and year). Jam must be less than 12 months old. Do not open your jar before the show. The judge reserves the right not to test any jar which has been opened before judging.
- 8) **HAND-MADE NEEDLECRAFT ITEM** : Embroidery, sewing, knitting, crochet. No larger than 18 inches.
- 9) **HAND-MADE ITEM – OTHER MEDIA** : No larger than 18 inches.
- 10) **PHOTO OF WYMONDHAM or EDMONDTHORPE VILLAGE** : Unframed, no larger than 8 x 6 inches.
- 11) **PAINTING** : Any media. No larger than A3.
- 12) **FLOWER ARRANGEMENT IN A JAM JAR**



CHILDREN'S CLASSES

Children are not restricted to only entering classes in this section but may enter any other section detailed above. They may also enter any class intended for older children.

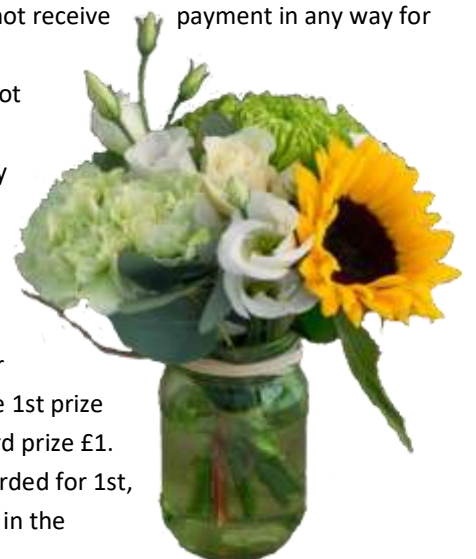

COMPETITION RULES (and TIPS!)

Show rules, conditions of entry and tips

- 1) Entries must be submitted by 11am on Saturday 22 June at the Berkeley Arms.
- 2) Entrance fees are 50p for each entry to each class.
- 3) Fix name labels to cake tins, plates, display equipment but not where it is visible when judging occurs.
- 4) The event will be open to the public from 12noon to 4pm on the day of the show. Entrants can collect their exhibit after 4.30pm.
- 6) It is hoped that exhibitors will allow their entries to be sold by silent auction for the benefit of organisations in the village. If you do not wish them to be sold, please remove them by 4.30pm but not before 4pm.
- 7) All entries must be the bona fide property of and grown, made or collected by the exhibitor.
- 8) Flowers for the flower arrangement in a jam jar may be bought.
- 9) No commercial mixes allowed in the cookery classes.
- 10) The pub will take reasonable care of exhibits and property etc. but will not hold themselves responsible for any loss or damage.
- 11) Exhibitors may enter no more than two entries per class. Children are limited to one entry per class.
- 12) The pub reserves the right to inspect the garden or allotment of an exhibitor (classes 2 and 3).
- 13) The decision of the judges is final but any protest relating to misrepresentation or any breach of the rules should be made in writing not later than 3.30pm on the day of the show and should be handed to the show coordinator who can make any further decisions.
- 14) All entrants must be amateurs in the field in which they have entered and not receive payment in any way for their work.
- 15) Any exhibitor not complying with the rules will forfeit any prize and their exhibit will be removed from public display.
- 16) Prize money for adult classes will be 1st prize £3, 2nd prize £2, 3rd prize £1. Medals will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in the children's classes.

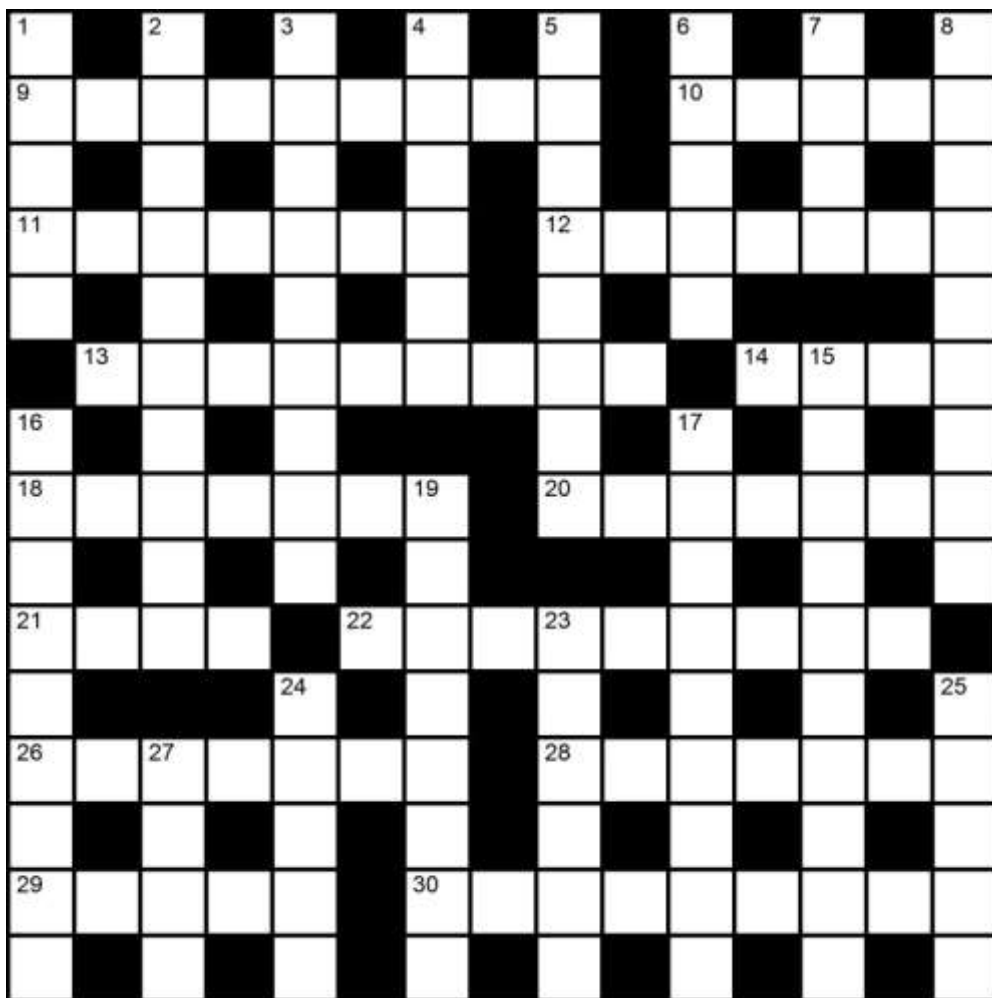

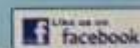

WYMONDHAM HERITAGE TRAIL



In 2015, the Wymondham & Edmondthorpe Civic Society created the Wymondham Heritage Trail leaflet which offered a guided walk around the village taking in it's historical sites.

Occasionally we'll reproduce excerpts from the leaflet, which is no longer in print.

ST PETERS CHURCH

Wymondham Church is dedicated to St Peter and is built in the early English, perpendicular style in the shape of a cross with decorated additions made mainly from local stone. It has a 13th century spire, while the light, spacious interior and windows date from the 14th century. The chancel has a wonderful east window made from Victorian glass.



The church contains two tombs of the Berkeley family and also an effigy of a Knight in the South Transept. This effigy, cross legged and in a coat of mail was traditionally thought

to represent Sir John Hamelin, who was living in 1324. However, it is more likely to represent his father Sir William Hamelin II who had a licence of a chantry at Wymondham in 1293.

The lower scabbard was supported by a small figure of which only the legs survive. The effigy is dated c1300 and is among a group of 48 effigies scattered across eastern England which have been stylistically identified as the work of a single workshop of carvers. The cross legged pose is found on tombs dating from between 1250-1350. The idea that this suggested this has something to do with the crusades is a myth. It is simply an artistic fashion of the time.
